As part of an overall programme to improve services and efficiency at the Registration Department, the Court Process Office has embarked on a series of training sessions at the Regional Police Training Centre.

One of the main aims of the training programme was to upgrade officers' skills in specific areas, such as stress and conflict management, giving evidence, taking statements, ethics, legislation, as well as the role of the Marshal in joint law enforcement initiatives. Marshals also benefited from self defence or survival training.

The training commenced in April with the first batch of twenty (20) officers at various levels. It is expected that by April next year 2006 all sixty (60) Marshals will have received this critical training. The training was an initiative of the office of the Attorney General, which was assisted with the course design by the Office of Public Sector Reform.
